

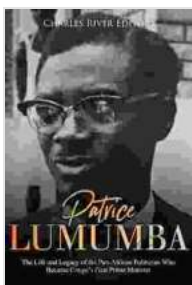
# Patrice Lumumba: The Life and Legacy of Congo's First Prime Minister

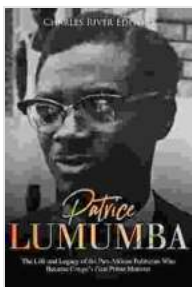
