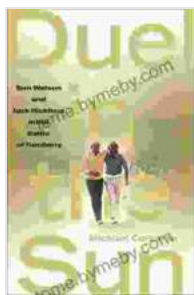


Tom Watson and Jack Nicklaus in the Battle of the Turn: A Riveting Golf Epic

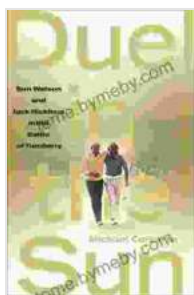

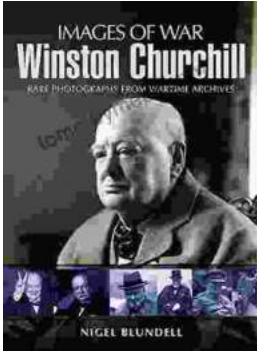
